Architectural Review Committee

The Architectural Change Request Form has recently been updated. The new forms are available on the Woodlake website and in the white box in front of the clubhouse. Please note that *the main reason for delays in approval is failure to provide the necessary information.* The current form (July 2007) was revised to clarify what is required of homeowners and includes a checklist. Please read the form carefully before submitting.

A couple of points about the review process:

1. The committee meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month to review requests. You must submit 4 copies of the completed Request Forms (and any other requested material) to the white box in front of the clubhouse the Sunday before.
2. Your submitted project is not approved to move forward until you receive approval in writing. For residents who provide an email address (space on top of form), we will notify you of the outcome the evening of your review.
3. The form requires that you obtain the signatures of all neighbors who can easily see the changes you are proposing from their property.

Finally, when you are asked to sign a neighbor's request for change, you are signifying that you have been notified of their intent, not necessarily that you approve of the project. If you have concerns about a neighbor's requested change and would like to come to the ARC review meeting, we have updated the form so that you may request email notification of the meeting date.

Buildings and Grounds

Trail Upgrades and Resurfacing: Several upgrades and resurfacing of the Woodlake trail system are scheduled for this fall.

Planned work includes installing new drain pipes and rolled curbing in several areas, replacing damaged trail sections, and resealing the entire trail surface. Other potential work includes installation of a new trail section to provide better trail access from Lakeshore Drive (near Cedar Hill Drive). Contractor proposals for this work are due on August 1, with the work to be done in late September through early October. Updates regarding the scope of work, work schedule, and notifications of trail closures will be posted on the Woodlake Announcements webpage.

Pool: The pool opened this year with a new contractor. At the end of the 2007 season, lane lines will be repainted, and the surfaces will be treated to remove the slipperiness. In addition, the pool rules have been revised to remove the restrictions on out-of-town guests using the pool.

Volunteer Work Day: A Volunteer Work Day is scheduled for this fall. Potential activities include planting spring bulbs and perennials, clearing trees and branches along the trails, and general cleanup around the clubhouse. If you would like to help, please e-mail whoa.grounds@yahoo.com.

What are my responsibilities as a Watch Member?

Welcome Committee



PLEASE Do not feed the Geese: Woodlake residents have various opinions on Canada geese. Based on discussions with multiple residents, the most common opinion is that while we want to maintain a natural environment, geese are a nuisance if their numbers become too large. The two most common complaints about geese are the volume of goose dropping on the trails and lawns, and the damage to yards caused by excessive grazing. In an effort to control the size of the flock, the WHOA has adopted several rules and has taken a variety of actions. The most important of these rules is to not feed them. Feeding the geese bread, cereal, or other material encourages them to hang around for a free meal. Prior to adopting the "don't feed" policy, there were up to 175 geese counted on the lake at one time. Currently the number is down to approximately 50. If you see someone feeding the geese, please tell them that the neighborhood has a policy to not feed the geese and explain why if necessary. Our experience is that most of the people feeding geese will stop if asked and say they weren't aware of the rule.
